GL Roberts CVI is a Mask Friendly Environment



Lunch will be provided. **Only Grade 9 students attend school on Tuesday September 6th**. During



the school day, students will receive their timetables, meet their teachers, and receive course information.



Our regular 2022-2023 school year starts for everyone on **Wednesday September 7th, 2022.** Prior to this date, students can access their timetable using the <u>Parent Portal</u>. Additionally, students' homerooms will be posted throughout the school on Wednesday September 7th. **Students need to be in class before the 9:30 bell**.

Students can request a timetable change during the first week of the semester, by completing the Google Form that will be available on the Guidance Google Classroom. Students will need to check their student email account for their appointment date & time. If you would like to register a new student, please contact our Guidance Office 905-728-7594 extension 228020, to begin the process.

MINISTRY GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Community Involvement Hours: This is a friendly reminder that students must have a minimum of 40 Community Involvement hours completed before the end of Grade 12. That breaks down to 10 hours per year. We encourage students to take some time this summer to complete these hours to reduce their workload throughout the academic year.

eLearning Requirements: The Ministry of Education has also implemented a requirement for students to earn 2 eLearning credits to earn their Ontario Secondary Diploma (OSSD). **However**, parents/guardians are able to complete a form and **opt-out** of this requirement. Please contact Guidance to complete and submit the form, if you would like your child to be exempted from this requirement.


